Staff Profile:-

Mr. Henry Gualbert Alexander

It was indeed a great pleasure for the officers of the Taxpayer Relations Unit to conduct this particular interview, with none other than our beloved, Mr. Henry Gualbert Alexander.

“Shy, quiet and reserved” at least that is how he describes himself. Mr. Alexander has been an employee of the Department for the past 28 years, having joined in September of 1972, immediately upon leaving secondary school. He swiftly moved up the hierarchy and at present holds the position of Assistant Comptroller - Property Tax & Tax Roll.

Mr. Alexander joined the Department at the ideal time. A time when there were many changes taking place with the Income Tax legislation. This afforded him the opportunity of being a catalyst in this major change process. As part of this metamorphosis, he served as the principle agent in the introduction and computerisation of the Income Tax Deduction at Source - Tax Tables. An achievement of which he is justifiably proud as to date these Tax Tables are still in effect.

As a long-standing and dedicated employee, Mr. Alexander worked in most Sections of the Department and at one point served as the Officer-In-Charge of the Vieux Fort Sub-office. In those days this office was not computerised and did not offer the various types of services that are available today. It was a very tedious and trying time, but served as a learning experience in Mr. Alexander's journey to the top. The office has since been upgraded to a Tax Service Centre.

He fondly recalls the first Unit he was attached to which was the Traders & Companies Unit. Today some of these responsibilities are dealt with by the Assessments Unit of the Data Processing Section. The interaction with clients from all walks of life, indeed made the average working day most interesting as everyday was a new challenge and experience. This interaction assisted in strengthening his interpersonal and communication skills.

Mr. Alexander spent most of his years working and eventually managing the Data Processing Section, the hub of many of the operational changes at the Department. It must be noted that this was the first section of the Department to be computerized. This became his home base and will always hold a special

Over the years, Mr. Alexander became the key resource person for all staff, even our external clients. This may in part be due to his participation in many international, regional and local training programmes. A few of the Courses which he attended were :

- * Tax Administration - Institute for Tax Administration, California - 1982
- * Center for Career Development - Revenue Canada - 1991 to 1992.

His talent and resourcefulness were further recognised when he was on attachment under the ECEMP project to the Grenada Inland Revenue Department in 1994. His task was to review the systems and procedures for the possible reintroduction of personal income tax.

A keen human resource development officer, Mr. Alexander served as Facilitator of our internal tax training programme which he conducted in 1998 and 1999 namely :

- * St. Lucia Income Tax Law & Practice

This Course is one which all officers attached to the Inland Revenue Department are expected to attend upon joining the Department.

Property Tax & Tax Roll

The quarter October to December saw the commencement of the final phase of the Property Tax Amnesty. There appeared in certain quarters to be renewed efforts in sensitising and encouraging the public to take advantage of the final phase of the Property Tax Amnesty. However, nothing substantial has come out of this effort.

The hearing of objections pertaining to the 2000 Supplementary Land & House Tax list for Gros Islet was held on November 6, 2000 at 9:00 am in Gros Islet. It seemed that the Magistrate was not satisfied with the evidence presented by the Department in determining the assessments. Therefore, he directed that the Department put its act

together and return to court on January 29, 2001 to present its case.

Tenders were received from six (6) persons interested in conducting the valuation of all properties on the island. However, they noted that sufficient information was not available to allow them to make a definite decision. The Department has since then supplied more information to those persons and has requested that they resubmit their tenders.

The Property Tax Assessments Unit has prepared a paper on the role that the District Councils are expected to play in the management of Property Tax on the island. The Unit, however, is anxiously awaiting

the enactment of a piece of legislation presently at the office of the Attorney General.

The Tax Roll Unit welcomed Ms. Cheryl Mathurin and bade farewell to Ms. Dilia Jn Baptiste, who will be missed as a part of Tax Roll.

Congratulations to Dwain Charles for receiving a Certificate of Merit; Mr. Cyprian Montrope, for winning the prestigious award of "Shop Steward of the Year"; and Mrs. Ernesta Weesbrook on her promotion to the post of Tax Inspector III.

Health Watch

What we need to know about HIV and AIDS

If you are going to be caring for someone with HIV infection, you need to understand the basic facts about HIV and AIDS. AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome) is caused by HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus). People who are infected with HIV can look and feel healthy and may not know for years that they are infected. However, they can infect other people no matter how healthy they seem. HIV slowly wipes out parts of the body's immune system; then the HIV-infected person gets sick because the body can't fight off diseases. Some of these diseases can kill them.

Signs of HIV infection are like those of many other common illnesses, such as swollen glands, tiring easily, losing weight, fever, or diarrhea. Different people have different symptoms. HIV is in people's blood, semen, vaginal fluid, and breast milk. The only way to tell if someone is infected with HIV is with a blood test.

There is no vaccine to prevent HIV infection and no cure for AIDS. There are treatments that can keep infected people healthy longer and prevent diseases that people with AIDS often get. Research is ongoing.

HIV slowly makes an infected person sicker and sicker. Diseases and infections will cause serious illness, but people often get better -- until the next illness. Sometimes, HIV can damage the brain and cause changes in feelings and moods, even make it hard to think clearly. Someone with AIDS can feel fine in the morning and be very sick in the afternoon. It can seem like riding a roller coaster, slowly climbing up to feeling good, then plunging down into another illness.

Senior Reviewer

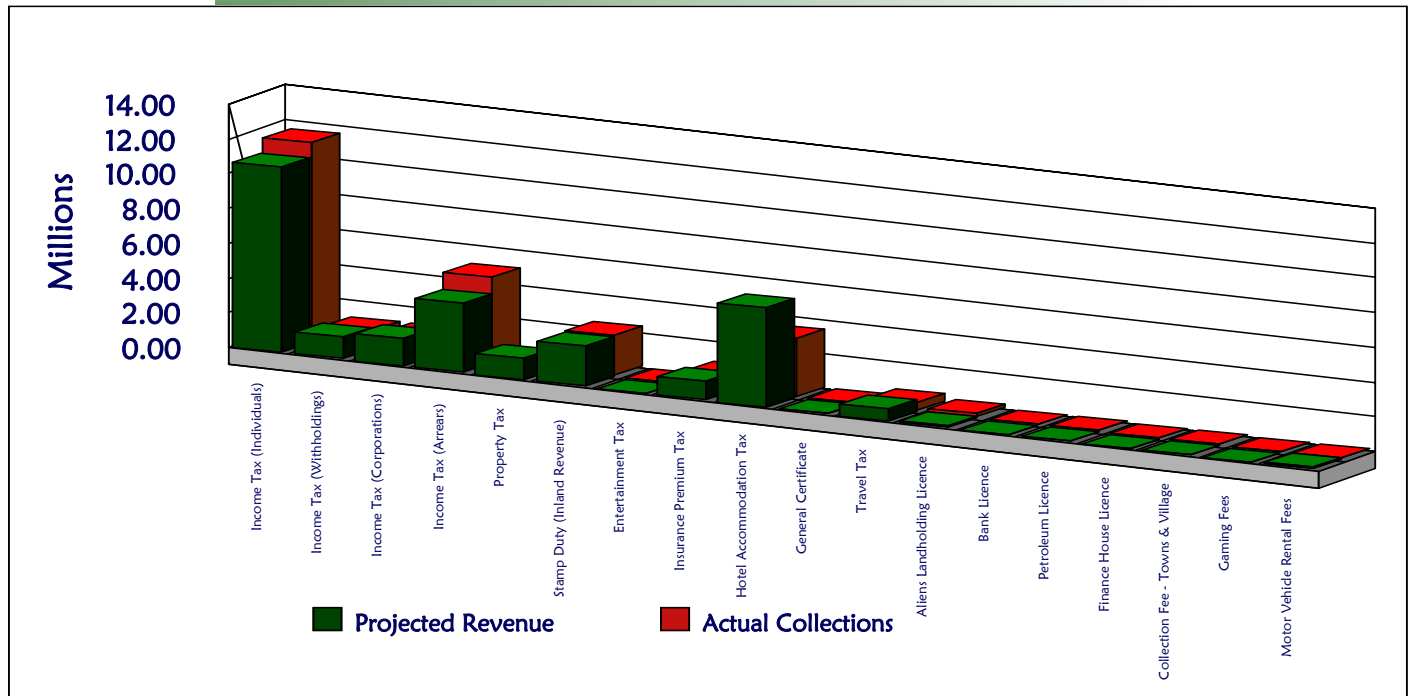
The Senior Reviewer performs quality reviews of completed audits to ensure that they are complete in procedure, precise in law and in accordance with established departmental policies and procedures. In performing this review the Senior Reviewer is to ensure that work papers are of good quality and that they disclose the scope, depth and techniques used in the examination which will support all conclusions and adjustments made.

The duties of the Senior Reviewer are as follows:-

1. Perform quality reviews of audits in respect of income tax and other miscellaneous taxes.
2. Provide guidance and recommendations to the Audit Supervisors on matters relating to the review of completed audit cases.
3. Ensure that auditors have provided quality inquiries and explanations of all proposed adjustments to taxpayers.
4. Provide information to taxpayers to promote good public relations and improve understanding of tax laws, regulations and procedures by:-
 - (a) Assisting in the interpretation of tax laws;
 - (b) Providing answers to controversial and complex problems.

This philosophy is so critical that it was integrated in the Mission Statement of the Department which was developed by management and staff at a Staff Retreat in 1998.

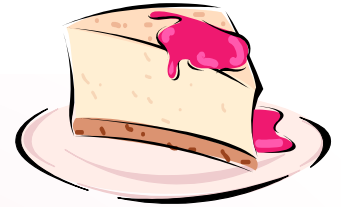

CLASSIC CHEESECAKE

2 cups graham cracker crumbs
6 to 8 tablespoons melted butter
1 pint sour cream
3 large eggs, lightly beaten
1/4 cup flour
1 can cherry pie filling, optional or fresh sliced fresh strawberries or blueberries to serve with cake

1/4 cup confectioners' sugar
1 pound cottage cheese
8 ounce package softened cream cheese
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla

Preheat the oven to 300 degrees. Butter a 12 inch spring form pan. Mix the pulverized graham crackers, sugar and melted butter and pat this dough into the bottom of the spring form pan. Bake for 15 minutes or until set, remove and cool before filling.

Raise the temperature to 350 degrees. With an electric mixer beat the cottage cheese, sour cream, cream cheese, eggs, sugar, flour and vanilla. Beat for 10 minutes; batter will be very thin. Pour over crust and bake for 40 minutes. Turn off oven but leave cake in for an additional 30 minutes. Do not open oven door.

Remove cake from oven then cool cake for 2 hours. When cool, run a thin metal spatula around edge of cake. Loosen and remove sides of spring form pan. Note that, when cooling, cheesecake will develop a large crack across the top.

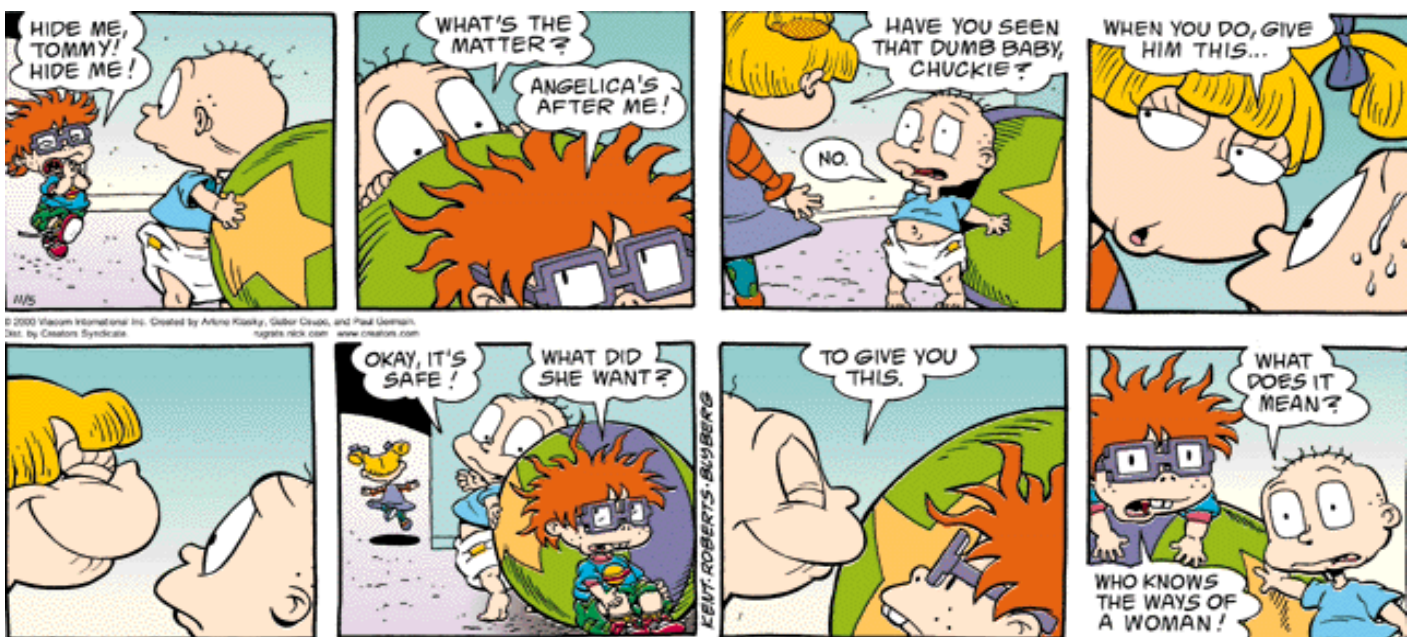
Slide cake onto plate. If you wish, top with pie filling or serve a wedge of cake with fresh berries.
